##### Annotations

- 7. Policy directives for the crime programme of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime and the role of the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice as its governing body, including administrative, strategic management and budgetary questions and follow-up on resolutions**

At its reconvened sixteenth session, the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice adopted resolution 16/6, entitled “Budget for the biennium 2008-2009 for the United Nations Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Fund”, in which it approved the projected use of general-purpose funds in the biennium 2008-2009 and endorsed the estimates for the programme support cost funds and special-purpose funds for the bienniums 2006-2007 and 2008-2009 for the United Nations Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Fund. In the same resolution, the Commission requested the Executive Director of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime to submit to it annual reports on the programmes and initiatives to be implemented by the Office in the bienniums 2008-2009 and 2010-2011 and on how they conformed with the strategy for the period 2008-2011 for the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (Economic and Social Council resolution 2007/12, annex), as reflected in the proposed strategic framework of the United Nations for the period 2010-2011.

In its resolution 2007/19, entitled “Strategy for the period 2008-2011 for the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime”, the Economic and Social Council requested the Executive Director to prepare the consolidated budget for the bienniums 2008-2009 and 2010-2011 on the basis, inter alia, of the strategy for the period 2008-2011 for the Office.

The consolidated budget for the biennium 2008-2009 for the Office presented an alignment of that strategy with the divisional structure of the Office.

At its eighteenth session, held from 16 to 24 April 2009, the Commission considered, under agenda item 7, the report of the Executive Director on the implementation of the consolidated budget for the biennium 2008-2009 for the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (E/CN.7/2009/11–E/CN.15/2009/11).

The consolidated budget for the biennium 2010-2011 for the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime focuses on the general-purpose resources of the Fund of the United Nations International Drug Control Programme and of the United Nations Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Fund. The consolidated budget also provides information on the financial situation of the Office, on the projected allocation of special-purpose funds and the programme support cost income earned from special-purpose contributions and on the resources of the regular budget of the United Nations. The expected accomplishments and indicators of achievement presented in the consolidated budget for the biennium 2010-2011 have been harmonized with the three subprogrammes of programme 13 of the strategic framework for the period 2010-2011 (A/63/6/Rev.1) and the proposed programme budget for the biennium 2010-2011 (A/64/6 (Sect. 16)), as well as with the result areas identified in the strategy for the period 2008-2011 for the Office pursuant to Commission resolution 16/4.

The Commission will have before it for consideration the report of the Executive Director on the consolidated budget for the biennium 2010-2011 for the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (E/CN.7/2009/13–E/CN.15/2009/23) and the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions on the consolidated budget for the biennium 2010-2011 for the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (E/CN.7/2009/14–E/CN.15/2009/24).

Pursuant to its resolution 18/3, the Commission will have before it for consideration the report and recommendations, if any, of the standing open-ended working group on improving the governance and financial situation of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime established pursuant to Economic and Social Council decision 2009/251 (E/CN.7/2009/15–E/CN.15/2009/25).

At its reconvened eighteenth session, the Commission is expected to review and approve the budget for the biennium 2010-2011 for the United Nations Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Fund.

### *Opening of the nineteenth session of the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice and election of officers*

Pursuant to Economic and Social Council resolution 2003/31 entitled “Functioning of the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice” and rule 16 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions of the Council, the officers of the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice hold office until their successors are elected and they are eligible for re-election.

In its resolution 2003/31, the Economic and Social Council decided that, with effect from 2004, the Commission should, at the end of each session, elect its Bureau for the subsequent session and encourage it to play an active role in the preparation of the regular as well as the informal intersessional meetings of the Commission, so as to enable the Commission to provide continuous and effective policy guidance to the United Nations Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Programme.

Pursuant to Economic and Social Council resolution 2003/31 and rule 15 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions of the Council, the Commission is invited to open, at the end of its reconvened eighteenth session, on 4 December 2009, its nineteenth session for the sole purpose of electing a chairman, three vice-chairmen and a rapporteur.

In view of the established practice of rotating the offices based on regional distribution, the officers to be elected by the Commission for its nineteenth session will be from the regional groups as follows:

Chairman	Group of Latin American and Caribbean States
First Vice-Chairman	Group of Western European and other States
Second Vice-Chairman	Group of Asian States
Third Vice-Chairman	Group of African States
Rapporteur	Group of Eastern European States

In accordance with established practice and Economic and Social Council resolution 1991/39, a group composed of the chairmen of the five regional groups, the Chairman of the Group of 77 and China and the representative of or observer for the State holding the Presidency of the European Union will assist the Chairman in dealing with organizational matters. That group, together with the elected officers, will constitute the extended bureau.
