

Integrating Drug Dependence Treatment and HIV Prevention



Bandung (Indonesia), 8 to 11 February 2011, Surabaya (Indonesia), 14 to 17 February 2011, Denpasar (Indonesia), 22 to 25 February 2011 - One of UNODC's current project involves the development and delivery

of training on integrated drug dependence treatment and HIV prevention across five provinces of Indonesia.

To establish the availability of drug dependence treatment and the training needs, an initial assessment was conducted in West Java, East Java and Bali. The team, led by Dr Tutut Purwanti, UNODC National Project Coordinator for Drugs and HIV/AIDS, will also undertake the assessment in Central Java and Jakarta. This information will be used to develop a one-week basic training package which integrates HIV prevention into drug dependence treatment activities.

Responding to terrorism in Indonesia



Jakarta (Indonesia), 6 to 10 February 2011 – Over the past several years, Indonesia and UNODC have collaborated closely on various aspects of criminal justice responses to terrorism; ranging from provision of expertise

for ratification, legislative measures and implementation capacity building to information sharing. Building on these collaborative efforts, Indonesia and UNODC are initiating a three-year (2011-2013) joint programme of activities.

The Directorate of International Security and Disarmament in the Directorate General of Multilateral Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs has led inter-agency meetings for preparing the partnership programme through “whole-of-government” participation. Consultations on the programme were also held with donor representatives in Jakarta. The latest collective consultation with donors was conducted jointly by the Directorate and UNODC, led by Mr. Febrian Ruddyard, Director for International Security and Disarmament, Ms. Listyowati, Deputy Director for Counter-Terrorism in the Directorate, George Puthuppally, UNODC's Senior Programme Manager for Terrorism Prevention - East Asia and the Pacific, and the UNODC Indonesia team.

The Indonesian National Police to fully support anti-corruption and transnational crimes projects



Jakarta (Indonesia), 24 February 2011 – The Indonesian National Police Criminal Investigations Department and UNODC

held a meeting on the department's leadership and involvement regarding UNODC projects and activities. Commissioner General Ito Sumardi, Head of the Criminal Investigations Department, noted the importance of UNODC's programme in strengthening the fight against corruption including its support to the Indonesian National Police on capacity building, specifically in corruption and transnational crimes. UNODC will attempt to facilitate trainings for Criminal Investigations Department officers from throughout Indonesia and the Indonesian National Police will target at least 200 heads of units from all district Police stations for capacity building, as part of an European Union funded project.

Indonesian Judicial Reform Team and UNODC agree on a new phase of judicial integrity project



Jakarta (Indonesia), 10 February 2011 – The Judicial Reform Team and UNODC discussed the new judicial integrity project planned to commence this mid 2011. Having the Blueprint of Judicial Reform 2010-2035 released

on September 2010, the Supreme Court prioritize five areas in accelerating the reform for the next five years, (1) limitation of cases appealed to the Supreme Court; (2) Chamber system implementation; (3) Re-arranging organizational structure of the judiciary; (4) Strengthening capacity of the human resources in judiciary by improving human resources database and management system; and (5) Improving public access to justice.

UNODC through the new Phase of its German funded integrity project will support on strengthening capacity of judges and court staff as well as to improving access to justice in particular at the Phase II provinces namely:

Widening future anti-corruption movement



Yogyakarta (Indonesia), 24 February 2011 – Resource Management and Development Consultants, a member of Insist Network and UNODC brainstormed possibilities of support that can be given to anti-corruption efforts

in Indonesia. Several ideas were deliberated towards widening and supporting the anti-corruption movement through the development of an information education and communication strategy on anti-corruption, identifying and supporting strategic partners for media campaigns on anti-corruption, planning anti-corruption activities and raising awareness in the region to support the national action plan on anti-corruption.

Global alliance strengthens commitment to fight wildlife-related and environmental crime



Vienna (Austria), 28 February 2011 – A new global alliance is taking shape to support requesting states in fighting powerful criminal syndicates that are plundering the world's flora and fauna. The International Consortium on Combating Wildlife

Crime, which comprises five international agencies – the Secretariat of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species, INTERPOL, the World Customs Organisation, the World Bank, and UNODC is working to adopt a comprehensive and collaborative approach to help to prevent the illegal exploitation of natural resources, including endangered species. The consortium met in February in Vienna to discuss future programmes.

UNODC response to the protection of women and children's rights in ASEAN Countries



Jakarta (Indonesia), 16 to 18 February 2011 – The ASEAN Commission on the Promotion and Protection of the Rights of Women and Children held a meeting as a

follow up to the Partnership Forum in Bangkok on January 2010. Margaret Akullo, UNODC East Asia and the Pacific Regional Centre Project Coordinator for Project Childhood, represented UNODC at the open session of the first meeting and delivered a presentation on the global plan of action to combat trafficking in persons and introduced Project Childhood as a regional response.

The ASEAN Commission on the Promotion and Protection of the Rights of Women and Children aims to promote and protect the human rights and fundamental freedoms of women and children in ASEAN countries. Linked to this, UNODC Indonesia Office is to explore opportunities around project development in this area of concern. and accomplices, and problems related to implementation of ratified international conventions.
