# After Scheduling

Once the scheduling of the new substances takes effect (different time-frame in the various Conventions) there are obligations from Member States:

- Implement the scheduling in the national legislation;
- Implement the required systems of monitoring and controls;
- Provide the information required by the treaties to the INCB.



# Take Effect

**1961**

As of the date of receipt of the notification by the Secretary General to State Parties.  
On 21 April 2017

INCB Yellow List

**1971**

180 days after the notification (18 October 2017)

INCB Green List

**1988**

180 days after the notification (18 October 2017)

INCB Red List

# State Parties Obligations

- State Parties are required by article 4 of the Single Convention of 1961:  
*to take legislative and administrative measures as may be necessary to give effect to and carry out the provisions of the Convention within their own territory.*



# State Parties Obligations

State Parties have treaty obligations to cooperate in international narcotics control and are bound to carry out the decisions of the Commission and to implement at national level control measure that mirror those indicated in the convention.



# Action by Governments (1988 Convention)

## Apply the measures in article 12 of the 1988 Convention

- Licit international trade monitoring → sending of pre-export notifications (PEN Online).
- Domestic controls.
- Provide for the seizures of any substance in Table I or II.



# Action by Governments (1988 Convention)

- Cooperate with other Governments in cases of diversion or attempted diversions → Precursors Incident Communication System (PICS).
- Report on Form D (annual):
  - Amounts seized and, when known, their origin;
  - Alternate substances;
  - Methods of diversion and illicit manufacture;
  - Licit trade and use.
