



### **Internship Announcement**

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The mission of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) is to contribute to the achievement of security and justice for all by making the world safer from drugs, crime, corruption and terrorism. UNODC Regional Office for Southeast Asia and the Pacific (ROSEAP) oversees UNODC activities in 29 countries and territories across Southeast Asia and the Pacific, including programmes implemented by Country Offices in Lao PDR, Myanmar, and Vietnam. Project Offices are present also in Cambodia, China and Indonesia.

UNODC ROSEAP is mandated to provide governments of countries of the Southeast Asia region with technical assistance to enhance the capacity of law enforcement agencies, justice-delivery services and health authorities. Currently, the activities implemented by UNODC ROSEAP contribute to the achievement of the results envisaged in the 2014-2017 Regional Programme Framework related to Transnational Organized Crime, Anti-Corruption, Terrorism Prevention, Criminal Justice systems, and Drugs and Health, and Alternative Development.

#### **Internship Objective:**

The internship programme of UNODC exposes qualified students specialized in various professional fields to the day-to-day working environment of the United Nations. As part of our team, working directly with outstanding career professionals and senior management, applicants will take part in high-profile conferences and meetings, and contribute to analytical work as well as organizational policy of the United Nations where their educational experience can be enhanced.

Under the supervision of the Regional Coordinator (Human Trafficking / Migrant Smuggling), the intern shall assist with backstopping the work of the regional programme on Trafficking in Persons (TiP) and Smuggling of Migrants (SoM) in the Southeast Asia and Pacific region.

#### **Specific Assignments may include (but are not limited to):**

- Develop weekly intelligence reports outlining TiP / SoM developments, with a particular focus on Southeast Asia and the Pacific.
- Conduct research on specific topics related to TiP and SoM as directed by the Regional Coordinator.
- Assist with the organisation of TiP / SoM programme activities, such as capacity-building workshops with law enforcement (may include some travel in the region).



- Support existing Tip / SoM programme mechanisms, such as the Voluntary Reporting System on Migrant Smuggling and Related Conduct.
- Contribute to consultations with partners, esp. other UN agencies, on human trafficking and migrant smuggling.
- Contribute to drafting/formulating programme proposals and other relevant documents.

### **Learning elements:**

After a 3 to 6 month assignment, the intern will gain experience in:

- Working in a UN environment.
- Understanding UNODC approaches to combating human trafficking and smuggling of migrants.
- Key issues concerning human trafficking and migrant smuggling in the Asia Pacific Region, and the linkages between these problems.

### **Expected Qualifications/Skills:**

- Holds a first university or equivalent in law (with a particular interest in criminal law), human rights or international relations;
- Have good analytical, communication and writing skills. Proven experience in research and drafting is desirable;
- Excellent knowledge of English with fluency in speaking, reading and writing;
- Strong interest in working in the UN system;
- Good IT competence and command of main office software programmes;
- Ability to work in a multi-cultural environment and a strong team working capacity.

### **Financial Aspects:**

The United Nations does not remunerate interns in any way. Costs and arrangements for travel, visas, health insurance, accommodation and living expenses are the responsibility of the interns or their sponsoring institutions. Interns will not be entitled to any compensation for travel arrangements to and from the work location. **Interns do not receive a salary or emoluments from the United Nations.**

### **Terms of Appointment:**

Duration of the internship is 3-6 months. Participating interns are required to work full-time during office hours. Time is allowed for outside research work and interviews.

### **Duty Station:**

Participating interns will work at the UNODC Regional Office for Southeast Asia, located in Bangkok, Thailand.
