Background

The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) is a co-sponsor of the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV and AIDS (UNAIDS). In accordance with the UNAIDS division of labour, UNODC is the lead agency for HIV and AIDS Prevention, Treatment Care and Support among drug users and in prison settings.

For the Programme *HIV and AIDS Prevention, Treatment, Care and Support in Prison Settings in Sub-Saharan Africa*, the UNODC Regional Office for Southern Africa is looking for an intern to support the National Project Coordinator in the Project Office in Maputo, Mozambique.

In line with the project objectives, the internship will focus on project management and administration within the focus area of HIV & AIDS in Mozambique prison settings. This includes assisting the office in compiling basic information, analysing key issues, collating information and documents received from UN/Headquarters/field offices and performing other duties to be assigned by the National Programme Coordinator and other authorities. Additionally, the intern will function as an intra-governmental and intra-agency liaison. The internship will also include selected field work and programme/project activities related to the priority areas of studies and internship of the selected candidate.

Interns should possess the following skills/background:

1. Interested candidates must currently pursue or hold a university degree in the life/health sciences or equivalent (completed or at least final year undergraduate level);
2. Candidates who have obtained their degree two or more years before the start of the internship cannot apply;
3. The individual must have a strong interest in the UN system (preferably in HIV and related fields)
4. Fluency in written and spoken English and Portuguese;
5. Good knowledge of all essential computer software;
6. Be available daily for a minimum of 3-months, preferably on a full-time basis.
