2. Election of officers

The Meeting is invited, under item 2 of the provisional agenda, to elect its officers. It is suggested that one Chairperson, two Vice-Chairpersons and one Rapporteur be elected.

The substantive items are expanded upon in the discussion guide (A/CONF.213/PM.1), which is to supplement the present annotations. In its consideration of the substantive items contained in the provisional agenda of the Twelfth Congress, the Meeting is expected to provide specific recommendations to serve as a basis for the draft declaration to be considered by the Congress.

The workshop topics are expanded upon in the discussion guide (A/CONF.213/PM.1), which is to supplement the present annotations. In its consideration of the workshop topics contained in the provisional agenda of the Twelfth Congress, the Meeting is expected to provide specific recommendations to serve as a basis for the draft declaration to be considered by the Congress.

6. Recommendations for the draft declaration of the Twelfth Congress

In accordance with paragraphs 2 (h) and (i) of General Assembly resolution 56/119, the United Nations congresses on crime prevention and criminal justice are to adopt a single declaration containing recommendations derived from

the deliberations of the high-level segment, the round tables and the workshops, to be submitted to the Commission for its consideration and action.

7. Adoption of the report of the Meeting

As the report of the Meeting is expected to be action-oriented, participants are urged to focus on specific recommendations, taking into account the regional perspective and elements contained in the discussion guide.
