The Secretary-General of the United Nations presents his compliments to the [Permanent Representative of (...) to the United Nations (Vienna)] and has the honour to draw the attention of the Government to resolutions 1/5 and 2/4 of the Conference of the States Parties to the United Nations Convention against Corruption on “Technical assistance” and “Strengthening coordination and enhancing technical assistance for the implementation of the United Nations Convention against Corruption”, respectively.

In its resolution 1/5, the Conference of the States Parties decided to establish an interim open-ended Intergovernmental Working Group, in accordance with article 63, paragraph 4, of the United Nations Convention against Corruption and rule 2, paragraph 2, of the rules of procedure of the Conference of the States Parties, to advise and assist the Conference in the implementation of its mandate on technical assistance.

In its resolution 2/4, the Conference decided that the Working Group should continue its work and reaffirmed that the Working Group should meet during the third session of the Conference and, as appropriate and within existing resources, should hold at least two intersessional meetings prior to the third session of the Conference.

The Government is cordially invited to participate in the third meeting of the Open-ended Intergovernmental Working Group on Technical Assistance, which will be held in Vienna, Austria, on 3 and 4 September 2009.
