**Budget:** US\$ 890,371

**Duration:** 2004-2006

This global project sets out to promote practical victim support initiatives through the funding of non-governmental support structures that target the needs of victims of inter-personal violent crime in developing countries, including trafficking in persons.

Funding for entire project: Governments of US, Italy and the Netherlands.

(2) Study on child marriages and its relation to trafficking in rural West Bengal (\$24,000)



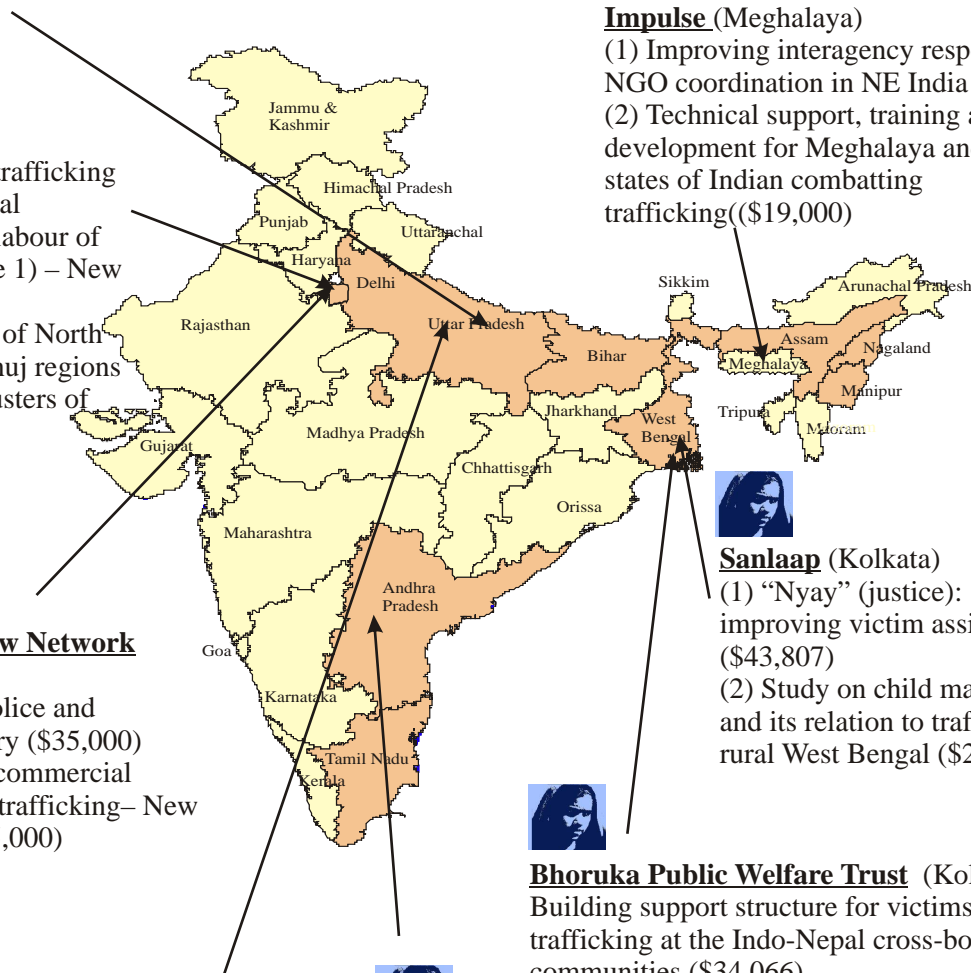
