## UNODC's Thematic Areas

### Organized crime and border management

Expanding the understanding on organized crime dynamics in Libya, combatting human trafficking and smuggling of migrants, enhancing support for detection, investigation, prosecution, adjudication of organized crime, and protecting of victims and witnesses.

Bolstering legal, policy, and institutional frameworks, in Libya, to combat corruption and financial crimes, including efforts in anti-money laundering, asset recovery, enhancing private sector integrity, and cultivating a culture of anti-corruption and integrity.

### Corruption and economic crime

Assisting in crime prevention in particular among youth. Providing support to criminal justice reform, improving access to justice for children, reforming the prison system, along with alternatives to detention and social reintegration in Libya.

### Crime prevention and criminal justice

Enhancing drug monitoring and analysis, supporting better access to drug rehabilitation services, improving HIV prevention and care for drug users and incarcerated individuals, and assisting in the development of a national drug prevention strategy in Libya.

### Drugs and health

Enhancing human rights-oriented, accountable legal, policy, and institutional frameworks while fostering both domestic and international collaboration concerning terrorism.

## Strong Partnerships

UNODC is supporting Libya in strengthening crime prevention and criminal justice, preventing and combating transnational organized crime (especially human trafficking and migrant smuggling, including of women and children), corruption and terrorism. It also supports Libya on drugs and health matters.

UNODC's work in Libya and the region is guided by the Regional Framework for the Arab States 2023-2028. The Framework sets out UNODC's mission to contribute to peace and security, human rights, and development by making the region safer from drugs, crime, corruption, and terrorism, including by reducing violence and inequalities within society.

## Ongoing Projects

### Countering organized crime, human trafficking and migrant smuggling and strengthening border management

- Strengthening North African Capacities to Safeguard and Assist Migrants by Combating Smuggling and Human Trafficking within Irregular Migration Dynamics. Partners: Ministries of Interior, Justice, Social Affairs, Health, amongst others. This is supported by the Kingdom of the Netherlands.
- Support for Maritime Safety and Security Management in Libya to address all forms of transnational organized crime in line with human rights principles. Partners: Ministries of Interior, Defense, Finance, Transportation, amongst others. This is supported by the European Union (EU).
- Establishing Reliable Forensic Services and Chain of Custody in Libyan Justice System to Combat Drug Trafficking and Enhance Case Resolution. Partners: Ministries of Interior and of Justice. This is supported by the United States of America (USA).
- Container Control Programme: Enhancing Port Control Unit Capabilities for Secure Supply Chain Management in Tripoli and Misrata. Partners: Ministries of Finance and of Transportation. This is funded by the USA.
- Strengthening the National and Legal Institutional Capacities of Libya through a Multi-Sectoral Drug Control Assistance. Partner: Ministry of Interior. This is supported by the Government of Libya.

### Anti-corruption

- Building Libya's National Capacity to Prevent and Combat Corruption and Money Laundering (with UNICRI). Partners: Ministries of Interior, Justice, Education, High Education, the Central Bank of Libya, amongst others. This is supported by the EU.
- Strengthening the private sector's capacity to prevent corruption and enhance integrity in the Arab Countries. Partners: National Economic Development Board, the private sector, amongst others. This is funded through the Siemens Integrity Initiative.

### Justice for children

- Ensuring Child-Friendly Justice for All Children in Libya (with UNDP and UNICEF). Partners: Ministries of Justice and of Social Affairs. This is supported by the EU.

### Youth

- Strengthening resilience among youth against crime, violence, drugs, and related problems in the MENA region. Partners: Ministry of Youth, Social Affairs and more. This is funded by Germany.

## Previous Projects

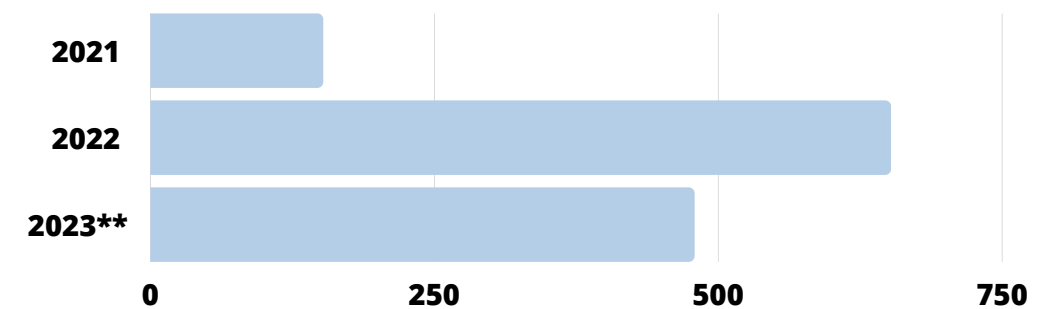


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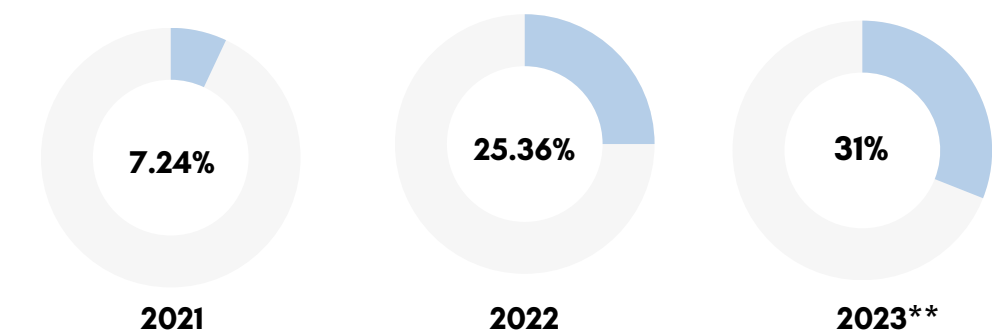
