- ▶ An effective way to deter match-fixing is by establishing national laws to criminalize such activity.
- ▶ Establishing a specific criminal offence concerning match-fixing may be more effective than relying on general criminal law provisions
- ▶ “ IOC – UNODC Model Criminal Provisions for the Prosecution of Competition Manipulation”

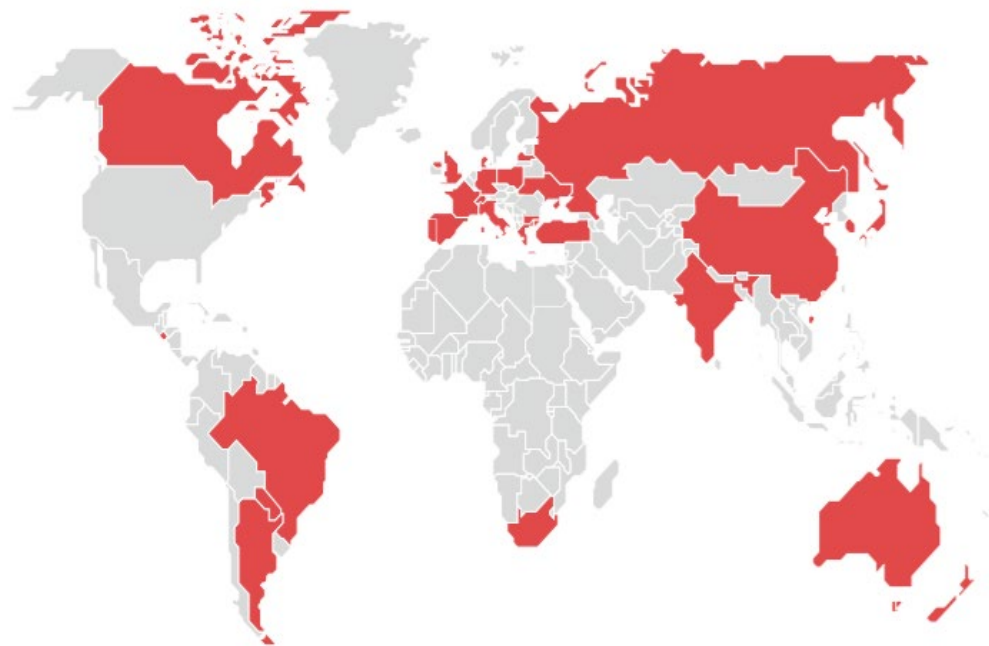
