



Ambassador Alena Kupchyna is the OSCE Co-ordinator of Activities to Address Transnational Threats. In the span of her diplomatic career, Ambassador Kupchyna was Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of Belarus and served as Ambassador of Belarus to Austria, Croatia, Hungary and Slovenia and as Permanent Representative to the UN, OSCE and other International Organizations in Vienna. She also served as Director of the Department for Humanitarian, Ecological, Scientific and Technical Co-operation, Director of Department for Humanitarian Cooperation and Human Rights, Head of the International Treaties Division, Deputy Director, Legal Department (MFA). Ambassador Kupchyna has extensive United Nations experience, representing Belarus in New York, Geneva and Vienna, including serving as President of the 17th Session of UNIDO General Conference (2017-2019), and Chair of the 28th Session of the UN Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice (2019). Ambassador Kupchyna was a Research Fellow at the Institute of Philosophy and Law at the Belarusian Academy of Sciences. She graduated from the Faculty of Law of the Belarusian State University with distinction, followed post-graduate studies at the Institute of Philosophy and Law of the Belarusian Academy of Sciences and holds a Doctorate of Law.
