

Dr. Alexandra Martins is a Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Officer and the Coordinator of the UNODC Global Programme to End Violence against Children at the UNODC Headquarters in Vienna, Austria. Her work includes the development of international laws and policies and the provision of technical assistance to countries worldwide regarding prevention and responses to violence against children, including the treatment of children in contact with the justice system as victims or alleged offenders. She has amassed over 23 years of work experience in the field of criminal law and child rights, having worked as a criminal lawyer in Brazil and as a Programme Officer with the international NGO, Save the Children, in Italy. Since 2005 she has been working with the Division for Operations, at the Headquarters of UNODC. She initially worked as a Crime Prevention Expert with the Justice and Integrity Unit, and also covered the functions of Programme Officer at the Latin American and Caribbean Unit. She attained her degree in Law from the University of Sao Paulo, Brazil, holds a postgraduate qualification in Criminal Procedural Law and a Ph.D. in Criminal Law from the University of Florence, Italy. She played a key role, as a staff of the UN Secretariat, in the development of the international normative instrument titled *UN Model Strategies and Practical Measures on the Elimination of Violence against Children in the Field of Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice*, which was adopted by the UN General Assembly in 2014.
