3. The thirty-first session will be conducted in a hybrid format, combining an in-person component with online participation.

In-person participation

5. The Plenary meetings will be held in the Plenary Hall (M-Building), the meetings of the COW will be held in Boardroom A (M-Building), at the Vienna International Centre.
6. In the meeting room for the plenary, two seats will be reserved for in-person participation for each United Nations Member State. In addition, there will be 10 seats for UN Entities, 10 seats for IGOs and 10 seats for NGOs in consultative status with ECOSOC reserved in the plenary Hall, which will be assigned on a “first come first served”-basis. The in-person slots for NGOs in consultative status with ECOSOC will be determined through the Civil Society Unit of UNODC and the Alliance of NGOs on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice. Only one representative per delegation from IGOs and NGOs can come to the meeting room at a given time, within the overall number of assigned in-person slots for IGOs and NGOs. Others can join online.
7. In the meeting room for the COW (Boardroom-A), two delegates per Member State can participate in person on a “first come, first served” basis. 5 seats will be reserved for observers. All others can join online. In light of the COVID-19 developments, journalists will be requested to follow the plenary sessions online.

Statements

12. All statements of Member States and other stakeholders shall be limited to **three minutes**. In line with past practice, statements made during the general debate shared with the Secretariat, including longer versions, will be posted on the [website of the Commission](#), unless indicated otherwise.
13. To facilitate the work of the interpreters, delegations are encouraged to share statements in advance with unov.conference@un.org (pre-recorded statements and statements in general).

Documentation

14. **Pre-session documents** of the thirty-first session have only been issued **electronically**, in all six official languages, on the website of the thirty-first session.
15. During the session, each delegation participating in-person will receive a single set of **in-session documents** (draft reports and draft resolutions) in the language of its choice. A distribution box for in-session documents will be assigned to each delegation outside the Plenary Hall in the M-Building. In-session documents of the thirty-first session will also be issued **electronically**, in all six official languages, on the website of the thirty-first session and on the Official Document System (ODS) website (<https://documents.un.org/prod/ods.nsf/home.xsp>).

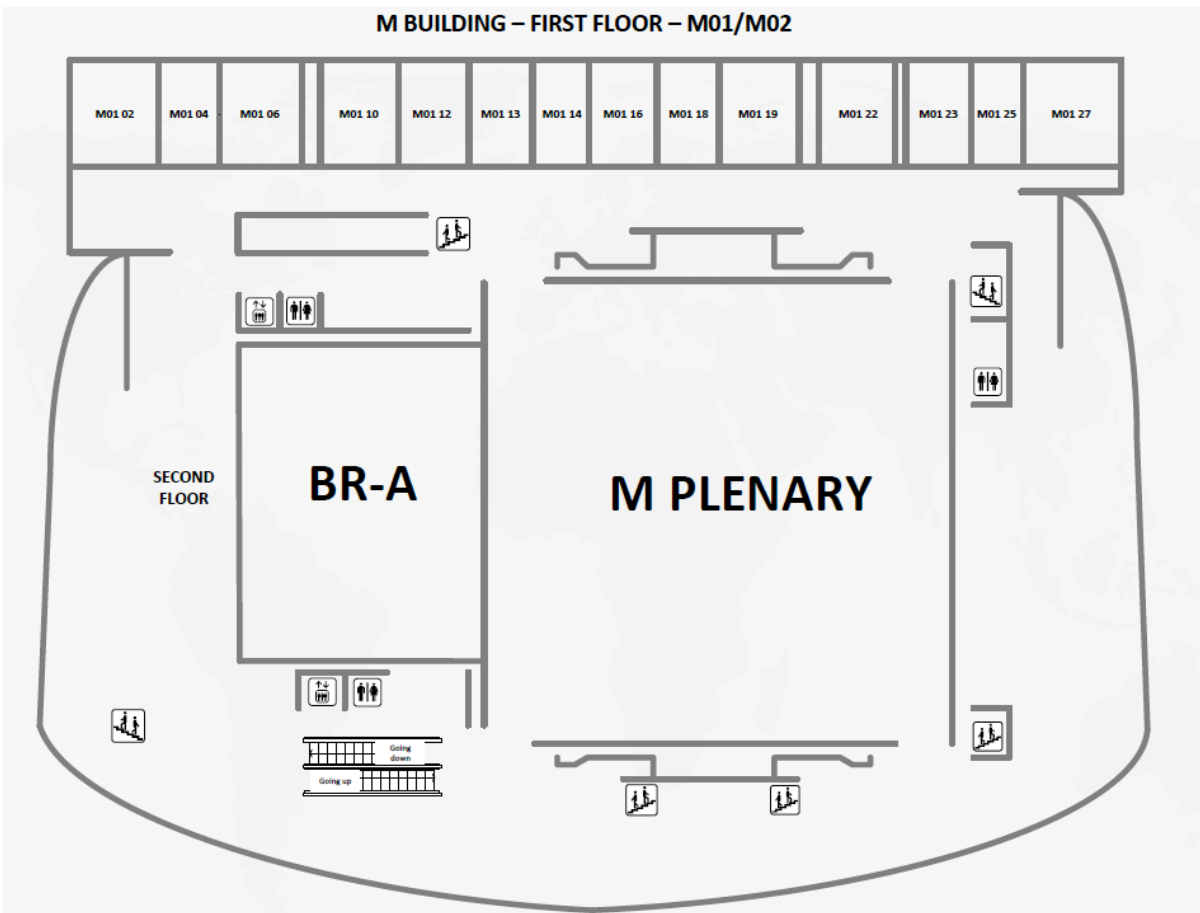
