

Andrea Huber is Head of the Human Rights Department at the OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR) since September 2020. Before joining ODIHR as Deputy Chief of the Rule of Law Unit in 2017, Ms Huber spearheaded the policy and international advocacy work of Penal Reform International, an international NGO specializing in criminal justice. As the organization's Policy Director, she was part of the revision process of the UN Standard Minimum Rules for the Treatment of Prisoners (Nelson Mandela Rules), promoted gender-sensitive detention standards (UN Bangkok Rules), worked to counter prison overcrowding and engaged in the context of the UNGASS review conference on drug policies. Previously, Ms Huber led the regional human rights work of Amnesty International as Deputy Director for Europe and Central Asia at the International Secretariat in London. Ms Huber is a graduate of Vienna Law School.
