

**Kenta Inagaki** is a Rule of Law, Security and Human Rights Specialist at the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) HQs in New York. Under the UNDP's Global Programme on the Rule of Law and Human Rights, he provides policy advice and programme support to UNDP country offices, particularly in the area of justice. He works as a core member of the UNDP's Justice Futures Colab and is leading its initiatives on access to justice, civil justice, criminal justice and incarceration. In the past, he represented UNDP in multiple conferences on crime prevention and criminal justice in the UN.

Prior to his current post, he worked as a Government Attorney at the Ministry of Justice of Japan, where he worked on the policy development and coordination of Japan's international rule of law assistance. In 2021, he played a key role in Japan's engagement in the 14th United Nations Congress on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice (Kyoto Congress) and in the establishment of the annual Global Youth Forum on a Culture of Lawfulness launched as a follow-up initiative to the Kyoto Declaration.

Before shifting his focus to international development and the rule of law, he worked as a public prosecutor for 7 years at several district offices in Japan, where he engaged in investigations and trials of various criminal cases, including high-profile and international cases.
