

Nekane Lavin is a human rights expert on administration of justice at the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights, where she provides legal and technical advice on human rights issues related to access to justice, fair trial guarantees and abolition of the death penalty. She has developed thematic expertise on transitional justice, racial justice and international justice mechanisms, as well as on child rights and migrants' rights. Before joining OHCHR in 2012, she participated in criminal investigations at the International Criminal Court, the International Commission against Impunity in Guatemala and the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia. She has conducted human rights monitoring of detention centres in various countries, including the DRC and Venezuela, where she coordinated the OHCHR monitoring and technical assistance programme on the criminal justice system.
