In-person participation

4. The Plenary meetings will be held in the Plenary Hall in the M-Building, the meetings of the Committee of the Whole (COW) will be held in Boardroom A in the M-Building of the VIC.

Online participation

5. The meetings will be accessible through an online conference platform. Statements

6. Statements of Member States and other stakeholders shall be limited to **three minutes**.
7. The name of the meeting and speaker, as well as the agenda item, should be indicated in the subject line of the email message and in the heading of the statement.

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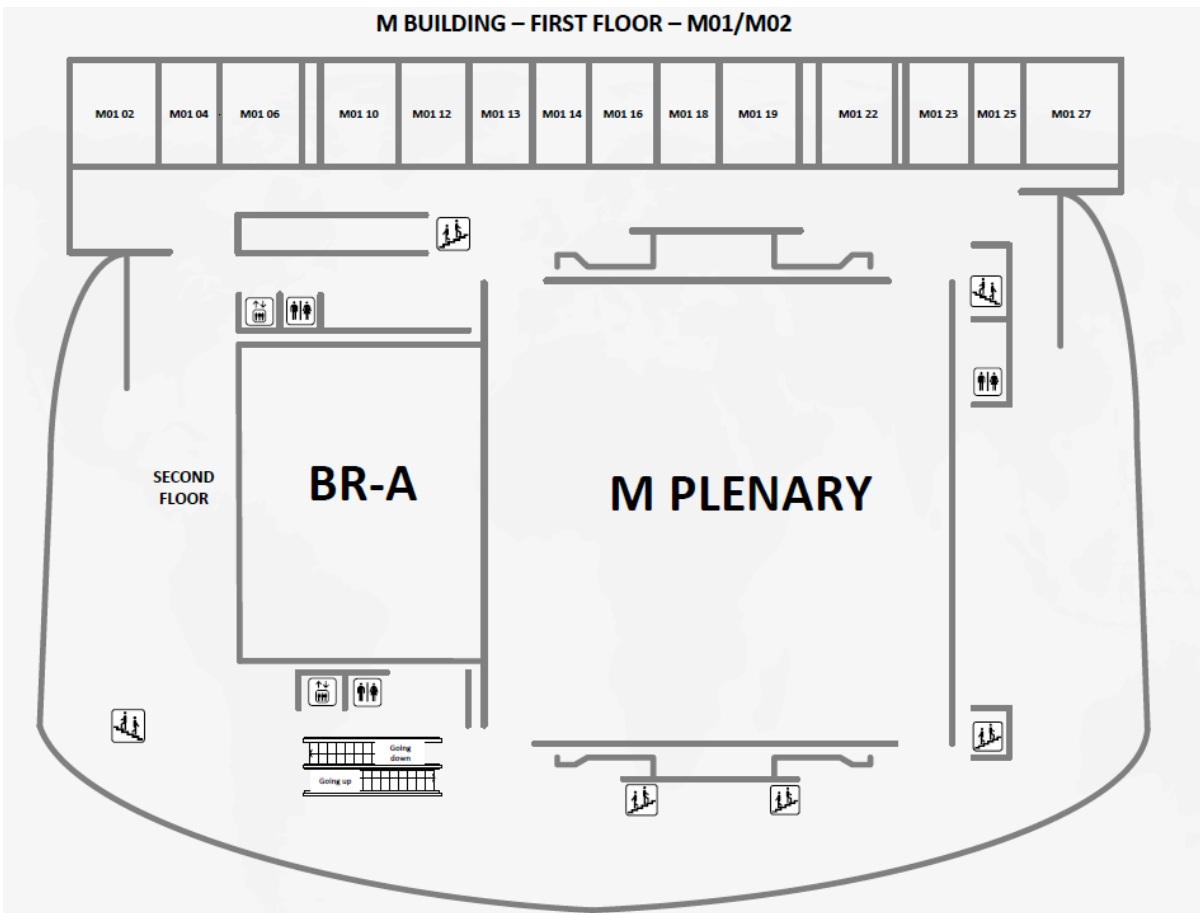
