Dr. Anuwan Vongpichet



Dr. Anuwan Vongpichet is the Deputy Executive Director and the Director, Office of Justice Innovation at the Thailand Institute of Justice (TIJ), where she has conceptualized and managed many justice sector initiatives. She developed the Rule of Law and Development (RoLD) Program, in collaboration with Harvard Law School's Institute for Global Law and Policy. Through the RoLD program, TIJ conducts workshops for Asian policy leaders. She also helped set up Thailand's first Office of Justice Innovation— of which vision focuses on “people-centered innovation and collaboration” towards access to justice. The Office promotes an ecosystem for justice innovation in Thailand, as well as incubates and scales solutions for the justice sector, using multi-disciplinary tools like design- and futures-thinking, as well as digital tools. Additionally, for TIJ's leadership team, Dr. Vongpichet manages key stakeholders regarding justice innovation, including the UNDP, the World Bank, the Hague Institute for Innovation of Law, and Stanford University. Before joining TIJ, Dr. Vongpichet was a Policy and

Plan Analyst of the Office of the National Economic and Social Development Council, Prime Minister's Office of Thailand. Her educational background includes a Bachelor's degree in Economics, Information System and Public Policy from Chulalongkorn University, two Master's Degree in Public Policy from Carnegie Mellon University and Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy in Singapore, and a PhD in Development Administration from Thailand's National Institute of Development Administration.
