Francesca Montagna is a Programme Manager at the Secretariat of the Istanbul Convention monitoring mechanism, at the Council of Europe. She has worked in this capacity for the last four years and supports the Group of Experts on Action against Violence against Women and Domestic Violence (GREVIO) in preparing its country evaluations and reports, as well as other outputs such as third-Party interventions submitted to the European Court of Human Rights (case Kurt v. Austria) and GREVIO's Mid-term Horizontal Review of baseline evaluation reports, of which she is a co-drafter. Prior to working for the Secretariat of the Istanbul Convention monitoring mechanisms, she worked for the Secretariats of other Council of Europe monitoring mechanisms such as the Committee for the Prevention of Torture (CPT), the European Commission against Racism and Intolerance (ECRI) and the Committee of Experts on the Evaluation of Anti-Money Laundering Measures and the Financing of Terrorism (MONEYVAL). With a background in law and an LL.M in international business law/comparative law from Queen Mary University, she worked as a trainee lawyer for the international law firm Linklaters in Milan, Italy, prior to joining the Council of Europe.
