

Lara Deramaix is Access to Justice Specialist in the Rule of Law, Security and Human Rights Team of the Crisis Bureau, UNDP HQ.

Lara spent all her career working towards improving access to justice for the most vulnerable groups. She started as an attorney in Belgium, dealing with cases involving both national and international law (refugee and immigration laws, criminal law, universal jurisdiction...) as well as human rights violations. She worked at *Avocats Sans Frontières (ASF)*, an international NGO implementing access to justice and justice reform programs in conflict and post-conflict settings. Lara then held the position of associate Justice Advisor for the International Security Sector Advisory Team (ISSAT) at the Geneva Center for the Democratic Control of Armed Forces (DCAF) where she had the opportunity to provide technical advice on Justice and Security Sector Reform programming to Member States and multilateral institutions, including UN agencies. Before joining UNDP Lara was acting as an independent consultant. She conducted several program evaluations and studies for different development institutions and international NGOs. For 3 years Lara was a volunteer mediator at the New York Peace Institute (NYPI) in New York City: providing mediation services in community mediation, Civil Court cases and criminal cases (restorative justice program).

Her countries of experience include Brazil, Burundi, Chad, DRC, East Timor, Haiti, Israel/Palestine, Morocco, Nepal, Rwanda, Tunisia, Zimbabwe.
