

Ms. Wendy O'Brien currently holds the role of Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Officer (Human Rights-Based and Gender-Sensitive Police Reform) in the Division of Treaty Affairs UNODC Vienna, where she works on knowledge management, and programme development and implementation, globally, in the areas of policing and access to justice. Ms. O'Brien also serves as the Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Section focal point on human rights, technology, and access to justice, leading on the development of guidance for criminal justice practitioners on the principled use of technology.

Ms. O'Brien holds concurrent appointments as Adjunct Associate Professor with Deakin University, Australia, and as guest faculty at the United Nations Interregional Crime and Justice Research Institute (UNICRI, Turin) where she delivers lectures for the LL.M on Transnational Crime and Justice.

Ms. O'Brien previously worked as Senior Specialist with the Australian Crime Commission, leading on the delivery of research, policy advice, and capacity-building to strengthen law enforcement and multi-sectoral supports to prevent and respond to gender-based violence. She has also held senior positions in academia in Australia, including as Discipline Convenor for Criminology at Deakin University in Melbourne. Ms. O'Brien has published widely in leading international journals on international law, gender, and human rights-led criminal justice reform.
