

Cecilia Naddeo is the Legal and Criminal Justice Coordinator at the United Nations Counter Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate (CTED). Prior to this role, she was a Senior Programme Management Officer and Chief, Human Rights and Gender Section, at the United Nations Office of Counter Terrorism (UNOCT). She was also a member of the CTED Africa Team, where she was the desk officer for several States in West Africa, East Africa and Southern Africa. She started her work at CTED as its Human Rights Officer.

Cecilia has experience working in academia in the United States, in the Inter-American Human Rights system (Inter-American Commission and Court of Human Rights), in supporting criminal justice reform efforts in Latin America and in the Argentinean criminal justice system. Cecilia was also a Visiting Researcher at Harvard Law School, a Marie Curie Research Fellow at Leiden University and a Post-Doctoral Fellow at the International Center for Transitional Justice (ICTJ). She holds a doctorate degree (Doctor of the Science of the Law) and a master's degree (Master of the Science of the Law) from Stanford Law School (United States) as well as a juris doctor degree (*Abogada*) from the University of Buenos Aires (Argentina).
