



Blaise Kuemlangan is Chief of the Development Law Service (LEGN) of the Legal Office of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) specialising in international law and fisheries and aquaculture law. As LEGN Chief, Blaise manages the delivery of FAO's legal assistance to Member Nations in the areas of food and agriculture including natural resource management by providing, inter alia, advice on implementation of international binding and voluntary instruments including legislative drafting and undertaking legal capacity development.
