2. A minimum of 200 copies should be provided to the Secretariat if delegations wish to have their statements distributed to States and organizations attending the session of the Commission.

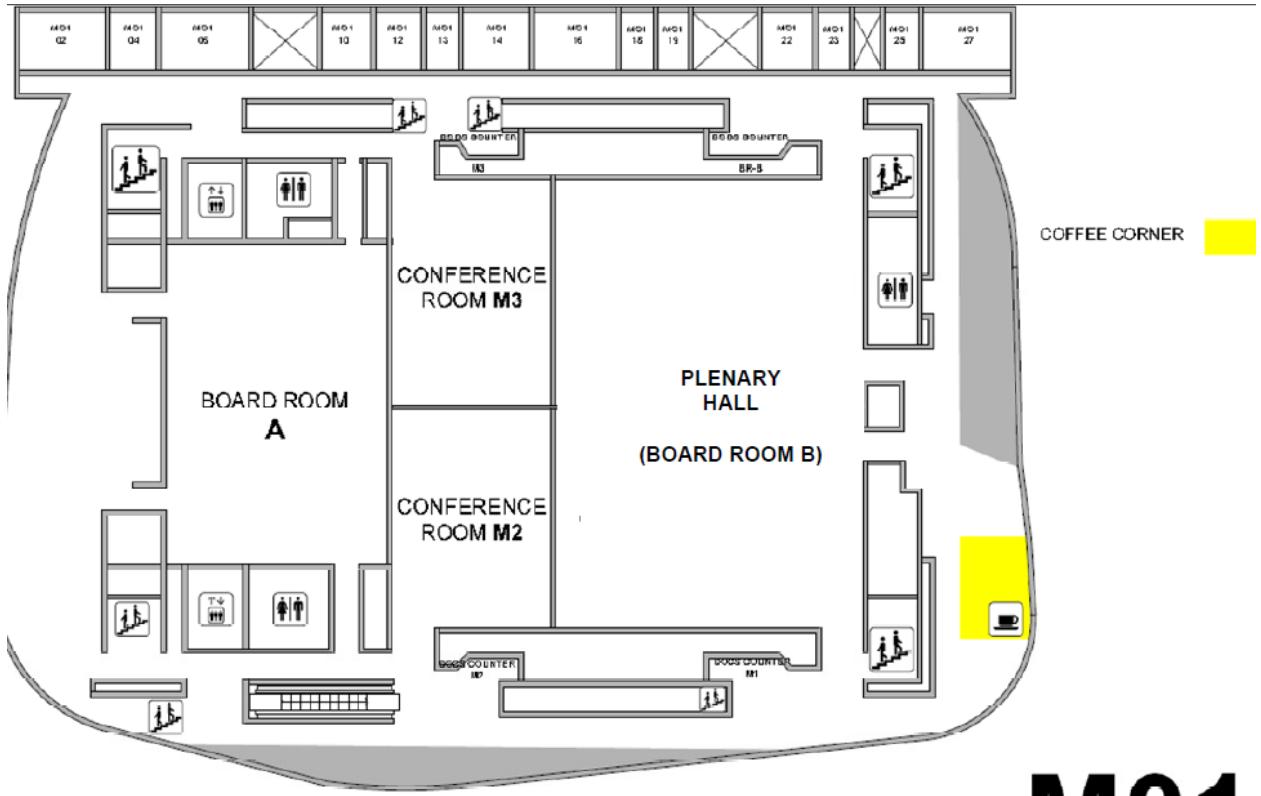
