Discussion

Under the INCB Cannabis Control Initiative (ICCI) the INCB is developing Guidelines on the International Drug Control Requirements for the Cultivation, Manufacture and Utilization of Cannabis for Medical and Scientific Purposes. The Guidelines are a key part of INCB's efforts to support Member States in better understanding and complying with their control and reporting obligations related to cannabis and cannabis-related substances, as set out in the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs of 1961, as amended by the 1972 Protocol, as well as in the Convention on Psychotropic Substances of 1971.

Efforts under the Initiative therefore strengthen compliance with the international drug conventions, facilitating access to cannabis for medical and scientific purposes while preventing the risk of diversion into the illicit market.

The aim of this side event is to present the Initiative as well as introduce the ongoing process of developing the Guidelines on the International Drug Control Requirements for the Cultivation, Manufacture, and Utilization of Cannabis for Medical and Scientific Purposes.
