## **Biography**

Carlos Timo Brito has been a career policy specialist with the Brazilian Federal Government since 2000, and he currently serves as Chief of Service at the National Secretariat of Drugs Policies and Assets Management, an unit under Brazil's Ministry of Justice and Public Safety. In such capacity, he advises and assists Brazil's National Secretary in the design, monitoring and evaluation of research and training programs related to drug supply reduction and drug control. Additionally, he acts as the Ministry's representative at several collegiate bodies and as a resource person in contacts with other government agencies, embassies, and universities. Prior to that appointment, he was the Chief Research Officer at the Brazilian Institute for Defense Studies, a former think tank associated with Brazil's Ministry of Defense. He is a former Taiwan Fellowship Scholar at National Taiwan University (NTU, 2018), AsiaGlobal Fellow at Hong Kong University (HKU, 2017), CAPES Scholar at Texas University at Austin (UT, 2009/2011) and Chevening Scholar at the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE, 2003/2004).

Timo Brito holds a BA and MA in International Relations from the University of Brasilia, a MSc in Criminal Justice Policy from LSE, and a PhD in International Relations and Politics from the University of Westminster.
