Portuguese National Drugs Coordinator since 2005, is the General Director of the General-Directorate for Service for Intervention on Addictive Behaviors and Dependencies (Ministry of Health) and he is also the National Coordinator for Drug Problems, Drug Addiction and the Harmful Use of Alcohol

A medical doctor by profession, João Goulão has over 30 years' experience regarding drug-related issues, working in this field since 1987 as general practitioner. He was a member of the Portuguese Committee that, in 1999, prepared the report on which the first Portuguese Drugs Strategy, which included decriminalisation, was based.

Portuguese representative in the Management Board of the European Monitoring Centre on Drugs and Drug Addiction since 2005, he served as Chairman from 2010 to 2015. He had previously served on the European agency's Scientific Committee (1997–2002).

He chaired the Horizontal Working Party on Drugs of the EU in the first semester of 2021 and is, since 2019, the Chair of the Permanent Correspondents of the Pompidou Group.
