



Mr. Matthew NICE is the United Nations programme manager for the Global Rapid Interdiction of Dangerous Substances (GRIDS) Programme and the OPIOIDS Project operating under the International Narcotics Control Board (INCB).

Following nearly a decade in drug control and policy efforts in the United States and New Zealand, Mr. Nice started at the United Nations in 2007 and was instrumental in the development and implementation of several innovative synthetic drug and chemical countering trafficking programmes, including: the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) global SMART Programme; the INCB Project ION initiative to counter new psychoactive substances; the UNODC Southeast Asia Border Management Programme; and the INCB global OPIOIDS Project. In 2020, he helped launch and manage INCB's Global Rapid Interdiction of Dangerous Substances (GRIDS) Programme.

While at the UN, Mr. Nice has developed numerous technologies and resources used by thousands of Government law and regulatory enforcement officers, including: the INCB Precursors Incident Communication System (PICS); the UNODC mobile Border Liaison Office Communication System; the IONICS Suite of secure mobile communications and targeting systems including, its GRIDS Operational Intel HD, GRIDS Strategic Intelligence, ChemProfiler and the ELITE virtual training environment tools. In 2022, Mr. Nice helped launch the Board's GRIDS Cyber Communication Centre (GC3) targeting centre, at the United Nations Office in Vienna.
