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## GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. A list of telephones in the M-Building during the **reconvened sixty-third session of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs and regular and reconvened twenty-ninth sessions of the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice** is annexed to this Journal.

### **In-person participation**

2. Given the COVID-19 pandemic and restrictions in place in Austria, only **one delegate** per Commission member may be physically present in the conference room **at any given time** (in addition to the individual conference badge, one floating badge per delegation will be issued). The limitation of one delegate in the conference room also applies to the joint sessions of Commission on Narcotic Drugs and the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice (CCPCJ), on 3 December, for those States that are members of both Commissions.”

3. In order to allow for physical distancing measures in the conference room, only participants with both the individual main badge and the floating badge are allowed into the meeting room. Floating badges do not show individual participants’ names and can be exchanged within the delegation. Please also refer to the **COVID-19 Guidelines for in-person participants**.

### **Documentation**

7. As part of the efforts of the secretariat to reduce expenditure and limit the environmental impact through the digitization of conference materials and documents, **pre-session documents** of the reconvened sixty-third session will only be issued **electronically**, in all six official languages, on the website of the reconvened sixty-third session.

8. During the session, each delegation of States members of the Commission participating in-person will receive a single set of **in-session documents**, in the language of its choice. A distribution box for in-session documents will be assigned to each State member of the Commission outside the Plenary Hall in the M-Building. **In-session documents** of the reconvened sixty-third session will also be issued **electronically**, in all six official languages, on the website of the reconvened sixty-third session.

9. A journal containing the daily programme and other information related to the conduct of the session will be posted on the website of the reconvened sixty-third session of the Commission every morning. A limited number of printed copies will also be made available.

### **Languages of the reconvened sessions of the Commissions**

10. The official languages of the meeting are the six official languages of the United Nations: Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish. Official documents of the meeting will be made available in all six official languages.
