GOING AFTER THE TERRORIST “BUSINESS MODEL”

“Disrupting financial flows remains a major challenge, one that requires a comprehensive, integrated approach that reaches out to all sectors and actors involved, private and public, and leaves no gaps for the terrorists and criminals to exploit”

The issue of terrorism financing is not a novelty, however it has evolved in terms of strategies and new tactics used by terrorist organizations, said Jean-Paul

Laborde, the Executive Director of CTED (Counter-terrorism Executive Directorate). We need to attack the sources of financing by using traditional but also the most modern means of international cooperation and exercise quick and active responses to request for information exchange. “Immediacy of response is simply imperative” he said.

Terrorists often route money through countries with weak counter-financing laws and expertise. International cooperation is therefore essential, said Yury Fedotov, Executive Director of UNODC. He reminded the audience of the most frequently identified technical assistance needs in countering terrorist financing, which are strengthening the effective cooperation between national agencies which are involved directly or indirectly in fighting terrorist financing and enhancing cooperation between regional and international

networks. UNODC leads a strong programme related to the prevention and suppression of terrorist financing.

Afghanistan has suffered from three and a half decades of war and continues to suffer from the challenges posed by terrorism, financing of terrorism and money laundering. But the Government of Afghanistan has made considerable efforts in combatting financing of terrorism according to Said Yusuf Haleem, Acting Minister of Justice of Afghanistan. The Law against Money-Laundering and Proceeds of Crimes and the Law on Combatting Financing of Terrorism are examples of those efforts. “One of the utmost important preventive efforts of implementing financial regimes is monitoring our financial institutions,” he said.

**EDUARDO VETERE
ADVISOR TO THE HOST
COUNTRY QATAR**



Eduardo is a Crime Congress veteran, already joining the meeting for the 8th time. He started out as a research officer with UNICRI at the Congress in Geneva in 1975 and served as Executive Secretary from 1990 to 2005. He sees the Crime Congress as the main international forum for policy matters in field, discussing current trends, identifying new threats and making recommendations. It is an important point of reference for the international community, not only for government officials who commit to implementation, but also for police, judges and prosecutors to guide their action, he says. Compared to the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice, the Congress has a much broader participation, it is an occasion to take stock and set the direction for the next five years and beyond. The Standard Minimum Rules for the Treatment of Prisoners, which were adopted at the very first Congress, have greatly influenced conditions in prisons ever since. Besides their impact on policy and legislation, it is the personal relationships establishing trust between the participants that Eduardo finds most valuable. He still remembers celebrating his birthday at the Congress in 1975 – without his family, but surrounded by friends. Some of the relationships established at Congresses last for life, Eduardo knows of at least two married couples who first met at a UN Crime Congress. He welcomes the Doha Youth Forum, which involved students who will be the leaders of tomorrow, as a great step into Crime Congress futures. Asked what the rule of law means for him: "It is not only law and order, but also freedom and human rights protection".


