TRANSNATIONAL ORGANIZED CRIME

Delegations discussed the need to extend and improve international cooperation as a basis for reinforcing the prosecution of transnational organized crime.

International cooperation featured prominently in the United Nations Convention against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances of 1988, the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime and the United Nations Convention against Corruption, Loide Lungameni, Chief of the Organized Crime and Illicit Trafficking Branch at UNODC, explained in her introductory statement.

Speakers said the international community should focus on the promotion and implementation of existing international instruments. Delegations found that effective combatting of terrorist activity could only be tack-

led through international cooperation and commended UNODC on the support provided to Member States in this area.

It was highlighted that international cooperation in criminal matters in accordance with international obligations and national laws was a cornerstone of the efforts of States to prevent, prosecute and punish crime, in particular in its transnational forms, and the continuation and reinforcement of such cooperation at all levels was encouraged.

At my first Crime Congress in Vienna in 2000, I still had to get to know the delegates, Linto says. Here in Doha, many of the experts attending are already familiar faces, which makes it easier logistically for delegations and for us. Working in the plenary can be challenging, especially when many want to change their speaking slots, but we try to accommodate all requests if possible. He knows: the most important thing in the plenary is to remain calm, this is something you learn over time. Many delegates feel the pressure when they support high-ranking dignitaries and we understand that. The perfect meeting for conference services is when all speakers adhere to the time limits, when everybody provides their statements for interpreters and the meeting starts and ends as planned, he says. The conference in Qatar was very well prepared in his view, "we could start working immediately when we arrived. The facilities are great, lots of office space, great colleagues".


