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# ICCS Pilot and Implementation in Africa

- The ICCS was endorsed in 2015 UNSC and the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice
- Kenya and Uganda were selected to participate in the pilot initiated in 2016
- The partnership between UNODC and KNBS was formalized on June 2017

# ICCS Implementation in Kenya

- ICCS implementation in Kenya is a collaboration of the entire Crime and Criminal Justice System and other Stakeholders
- The collaboration achieved through membership of Governance, Peace and Security Statistics Technical Working Group (GPSS-TWG)
- The TWC coordinates governance, peace and security statistics data production and dissemination
- The TWC produces chapter on GPS statistics in annual economic survey and statistical abstract

  1. Assessment on Crime and Criminal Justice Statistics \_June 2017,
  2. National Multi-Stakeholder Workshop on Administrative Data on Crime and Criminal Justice \_December 2017 attended by 33 participants,
  3. National Workshop on the Implementation of the International Classification of Crime for Statistical Purposes \_May 2018 attended by 24 participants.

# 1. The assessment

- Conducted by UNODC
- Focused on:
  - ❖ Institutional framework,
  - ❖ Organizational arrangements,
  - ❖ Standard procedures,
  - ❖ Technical skills,
  - ❖ Resource availability and
  - ❖ Quality of data processes for the production of crime and criminal justice system statistics in Kenya.

## 2. National Multi-Stakeholder Workshop on Administrative Data on Crime and Criminal Justice

- The workshop was organized to draft the Roadmap for implementation of ICCS
- After the workshop, the roadmap was finalized and approved by KNBS
- **Building Correspondence Tables**
  - ❖ A match between the ICCS and the National Criminal Law,
  - ❖ Done in four levels
  - ❖ Using the 11 ICCS categories

# Building Correspondence Tables

- The process of matching National Crime Categories into the ICCS
- Done in three steps:
  - ✓ 1. Learning about ICCS and National Laws
  - ✓ 2. Initiating correspondence mapping
  - ✓ 3. Final review
