


## **GGE PACAS in general**

- ▶ mandated by General Assembly resolution 72/55

## **GGE composition and sessions**

- ▶ geographically-diverse and gender-balanced
- ▶ 18 experts:  
Germany (chair), Argentina, Austria, China, France, Jamaica, Republic of Korea, Montenegro, Singapore, United Kingdom, United States, South Africa, Brazil, Switzerland, Colombia, Egypt, Ghana, Portugal



## Comprehensive consideration of

- ▶ unplanned explosions at munition sites  
→ **safety** aspect of conventional ammunition management
- ▶ diversion of ammunition to unauthorized recipients  
→ **security** aspect



# GGE PACAS - main substantive conclusions & recommendations

## 1) Interpretation of the Group's mandate

- ▶ comprehensive consideration of safety and security risks posed by unplanned explosions and diversion
- ▶ ineffective physical security & stockpile management continues to contribute to surplus growth & to safety and security risks (cf. predecessor GGE in 2008)
- ▶ Safety and security problems extend *beyond* national stockpile facilities. Challenges exist *throughout the life cycle* of the ammunition, from the point of manufacture until disposal or use.




## **2) operational guidelines on supply-chain security and diversion monitoring**

- ▶ voluntary guidelines to complement existing standards, guidelines and best practices (incl. IATG)
- ▶ focus *beyond* stockpiles to address the *entirety of the ammunition supply chain* from production to use or disposal


## **3) relationship between conventional ammunition and existing frameworks and processes**

- ▶ various existing frameworks and processes that could support safe, secure & sustainable ammunition management, e.g.
  - 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development
  - Secretary-General's Agenda for Disarmament
- ▶ integrate relevant ammunition management programming within sustainable development cooperation frameworks

## **The Resolution “Problems arising from the accumulation of conventional ammunition stockpiles in surplus” (A/C.1/76/L.47, 1st Committee, 76th UNGA)**

- ▶ “welcomes” the GGE Report
- ▶ encourages States to consider GGE recommendations

17. *Decides* to establish an open-ended working group to elaborate a set of political commitments as a new global framework that will address existing gaps in through-life ammunition management, including international cooperation and assistance, without prejudice to national legal systems addressing national ammunition ownership, possession and use, and will be part of a comprehensive framework to support safe, secure and sustainable through-life ammunition management at the national, subregional, regional and global levels, building upon and complementing existing frameworks, whereas cooperation at the regional and subregional levels should be considered on a voluntary basis;

18. *Also decides* that the open-ended working group shall take into account the recommendations contained in the report of the Group of Governmental Experts established pursuant to resolution [72/55](#) and the views of all participating States and be informed by the series of informal consultations convened within the framework of its resolution [72/55](#) throughout 2018 and 2019, the informal paper presented by Germany on the informal consultative process and the inputs, both written and oral, received from Member States on the same matter:



## The Resolution – Mandate for the OEWG

- ▶ OEWG to elaborate a set of **political commitments** as a new **global framework** addressing existing **gaps in through-life ammunition management**, including international **cooperation and assistance**
- ▶ without prejudice to national legal systems addressing national ammunition ownership, possession and use
- ▶ Together with **actions** at the **national, sub-regional and regional level**, these commitments would form a **comprehensive framework** to support **safe, secure, and sustainable through-life ammunition management**.



## **OEWG on conventional ammunition**

- ▶ Official title  
*“OEWG established pursuant to General Assembly resolution 76/233 to elaborate a set of political commitments as a new global framework that will address existing gaps in through-life ammunition management”*  
aka **OEWG on conventional ammunition**
- ▶ 15 working days for the OEWG’s work in 2022 and 2023
- ▶ provide the 78. GA with a set of political commitments
