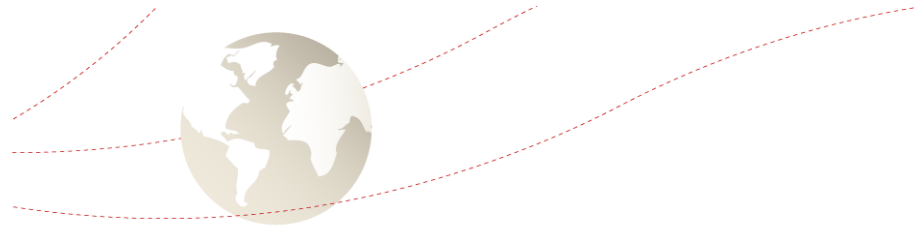




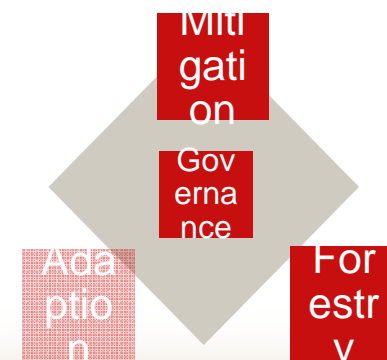
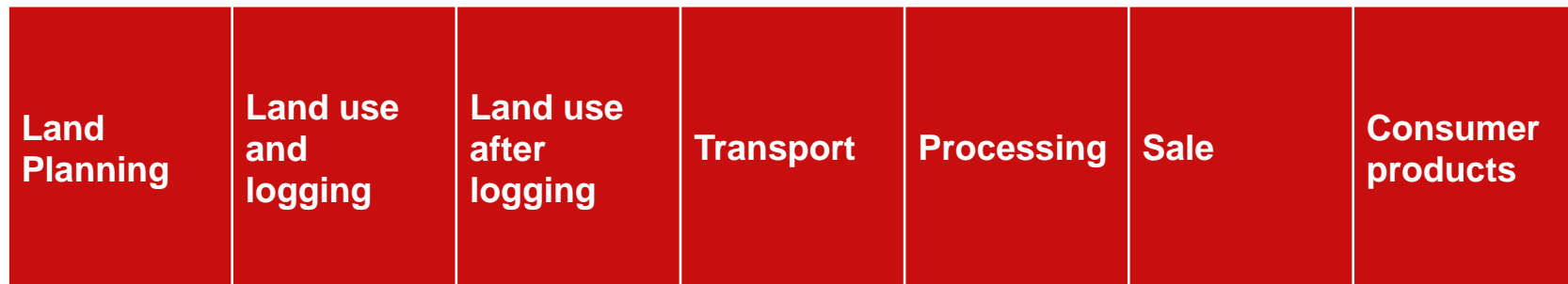
Governance and Climate Finance Readiness

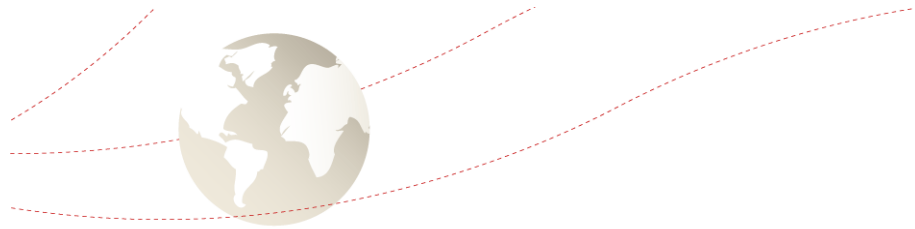
- Building the capacity of developing countries to effectively plan for, access and monitor climate finance, and to implement effective activities.

- Aim: Transparent adaptation and mitigation results



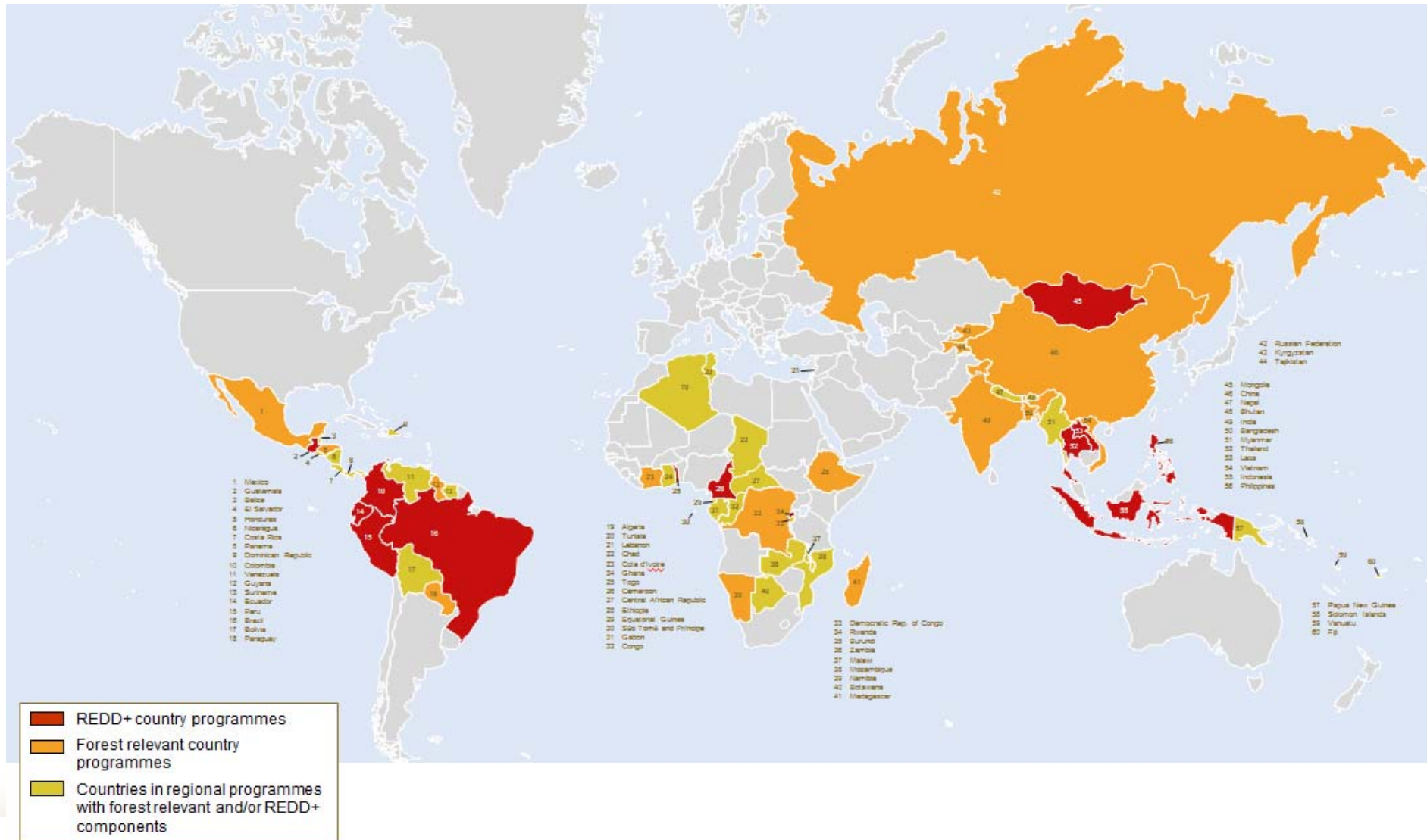


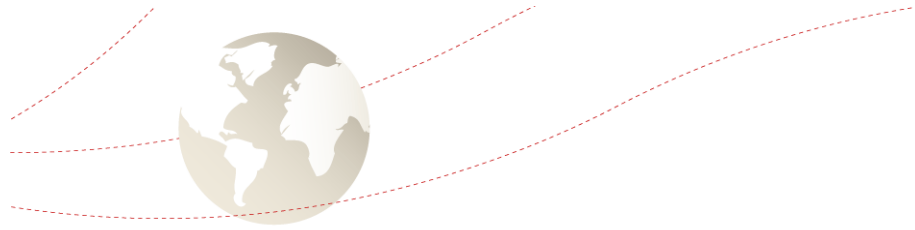
Corruption risks in forestry
