The Secretary-General of the United Nations presents his compliments to the [[[FunctionalTitle2]]] and has the honour to draw the attention of the Government to General Assembly resolution 58/4 of 31 October 2003 entitled “United Nations Convention against Corruption”.

Pursuant to article 63 of the Convention, a Conference of the States Parties to the Convention has been established to improve the capacity of and cooperation between States Parties, to achieve the objectives set forth in the Convention and to promote and review its implementation.

In its decision 4/2 entitled “Venue for the seventh session of the Conference of the States Parties to the United Nations Convention against Corruption”, the Conference decided that its seventh session will be held at the seat of the secretariat.

The Government is cordially invited to participate in the **seventh session of the Conference of the States Parties to the United Nations Convention against Corruption**, which will be held at the **United Nations Office at Vienna, Vienna International Centre, M-Building, from 6-10 November 2017**.

Pursuant to the decisions taken by the Conference at its sixth session, the Conference is expected to concentrate on key issues regarding the review of the implementation of the Convention, asset recovery, international cooperation, prevention and technical assistance. In keeping with past practice, the general discussion of the Conference will serve as an opportunity for high-level representatives to address the Conference and provide guidance for its deliberations and the achievement of its objectives. In view of the significance of the matters to be discussed by the Conference and the need to reach key decisions, the Government is encouraged to be represented at the highest possible political level and to include in its delegation policymakers and experts on the issues to be covered by the Conference.

Rule 18, entitled “Submission of credentials”, of the rules of procedure of the Conference of the States Parties provides that the credentials of representatives of each State Party and the names of the persons constituting the State party’s delegation shall be submitted to the secretariat if possible not later than twenty-four hours in advance of the opening of the session.

The rules of procedure also provide that the credentials shall be issued by the Head of State or Government, by the Minister for Foreign Affairs or by the Permanent Representative to the United Nations of the State party in accordance with its domestic law or, in the case of a regional economic integration organization, by the competent authority of that organization.
