(12th open-ended intergovernmental expert meeting to enhance international cooperation under the United Nations Convention against Corruption)

The secretariat of the Conference of the States Parties to the United Nations Convention against Corruption presents its compliments to the [...] and has the honour to invite the Government to participate in the **twelfth open-ended intergovernmental expert meeting to enhance international cooperation under the United Nations Convention against Corruption**, to be held in **Boardroom B/M1, M-Building**, Vienna International Centre, Vienna, Austria, from **4 to 8 September 2023**.

In its resolution 4/2, the Conference of the States Parties to the United Nations Convention against Corruption decided to convene open-ended intergovernmental expert meetings to enhance international cooperation. The functions of the meetings are to assist it in developing cumulative knowledge in the area of international cooperation and encourage such cooperation, facilitate the exchange of experiences among States parties and assist the Conference in identifying the capacity-building needs of States.

The proposed organization of work for the twelfth meeting (enclosed annex) was prepared in line with resolutions 9/1, 9/2, 9/3 and 9/5 of the Conference and the guidance contained in the workplan for the subsidiary bodies of the Conference, which was approved by the Bureau of the Conference, in order to enable consideration of agenda items 3 and 4 jointly with the Implementation Review Group and the Working Group on Asset Recovery. The thematic focus of the twelfth open-ended intergovernmental expert meeting to enhance international cooperation will be on “Promoting the use of information and communications technologies for the implementation of the Convention” and the non-binding guidelines for strengthening international and multilateral cooperation to further prevent, identify, investigate and prosecute corruption during times of emergencies and crisis response and recovery. Documentation, including the annotated provisional agenda and proposed organization of work, will be electronically available in all the official languages of the United Nations on the web pages of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, and can be accessed through the following addresses:

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The session will be held in person. Participants will be able to observe the proceedings online, but in order to facilitate the work of the interpreters, only 30 minutes of each three-hour meeting will be allotted to statements delivered remotely by online participants. Delegations are therefore encouraged to ensure, to the extent possible, that statements are delivered by the representatives present in the meeting room.

Arrangements have also been made to allow for pre-recorded video statements. Such pre-recorded video statements will not be counted towards the 30 minute limit for online participation per meeting but, in line with a decision by the President of the Conference, must be limited to three minutes to ensure that all delegations will have an opportunity to contribute to the discussions. All pre-recorded video statements, including transcripts, should be submitted by **Wednesday, 28 August 2023**.

Delegations are also encouraged to provide copies of statements in written format for posting on a dedicated space on the website of the session and to adhere to the recommendations for the submission of pre-recorded statements available on the website of the meeting. Pre-recorded video statements (including transcripts) or written statements should be submitted via email to [uncac@un.org](mailto:uncac@un.org) and [unov.conference@un.org](mailto:unov.conference@un.org), including a subject line in the following format: “12th EMIC statement – [country name] [agenda item number]”).

The twelfth open-ended intergovernmental expert meeting to enhance international cooperation, the resumed fourteenth session of the Implementation Review Group and the seventeenth session of the Working Group on Asset Recovery under the United Nations Convention against Corruption are to hold joint meetings on thematic and technical assistance matters (Ref.: CU 2023/228(A)/DTA/CEB/CSS and CU 2023/229(A)/DTA/CEB/CSS). In view of the joint meetings and due to technical reasons, the Government is requested to issue only one note verbale containing the composition of its delegation for the three meetings. The registration for the joint meetings is set up as one event in INDICO.
