Implementation Review Group: eleventh session

The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime presents its compliments to the [...] and has the honour to cordially invite the Government to participate in the **eleventh session of the Implementation Review Group**, which will be held in a **virtual format** in Vienna from **29 June to 1 July 2020** and will consist of two two-hour meetings per day (the exact times and technical parameters for the session will be communicated at a later stage through the website of the Implementation Review Group). The session was rescheduled from the original dates, which were from 8 to 10 June 2020, following the recommendation of the Bureau of the Conference of the States Parties to the United Nations Convention against Corruption at its eighth session (the provisional agenda is contained in the Annex).

The Implementation Review Group was established by the Conference of the States Parties to the United Nations Convention against Corruption in its resolution 3/1, entitled “Review mechanism”, as an open-ended intergovernmental group of States parties to operate under its authority and report to it. The Group is to have an overview of the review process in order to identify challenges and good practices and to consider technical assistance requirements in order to ensure effective implementation of the Convention.

In accordance with the workplan for subsidiary bodies of the Conference of the States Parties to the United Nations Convention against Corruption, which was adopted by the Conference at its eighth session held in December 2019, the thematic focus of the eleventh session of the Group will be on prevention, as well as criminalization and law enforcement. Moreover, in accordance with that workplan, the Group and the Open-ended Intergovernmental Working Group on the Prevention of Corruption, to be held on 30 June and 1 July 2020, are to hold joint meetings on thematic and technical assistance matters. Following the recommendation of the Bureau of the Conference, the consideration of the item entitled “Technical assistance” has been postponed to the first resumed eleventh session of the Group to be held on 31 August and 1 September 2020.

Documentation, including the annotated provisional agenda and the revised organization of work, will be electronically available in all the official languages of the United Nations on the web page of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, and can be accessed through the following addresses:

In view of the compressed organization of work for this session, as well as its virtual format, delegations are encouraged, instead of delivering general national statements during the meeting, to provide such statements in written format for posting on a dedicated space on the website of the session.
