1. Preventive measures linked to sport

- A) Legislation, policies, regulations and assessments
 - UNCAC articles 5 (preventive AC policies), 7 (conflict of interest) 8 (codes of conduct), 10 (public reporting)
- B) Education, training and awareness-raising
 - UNCAC article 12 (private sector), 13 (participation of society)
- C) Establishment mechanisms to support good governance and integrity



2. Enforcement activities of relevant stakeholders in relation to offences linked to sport

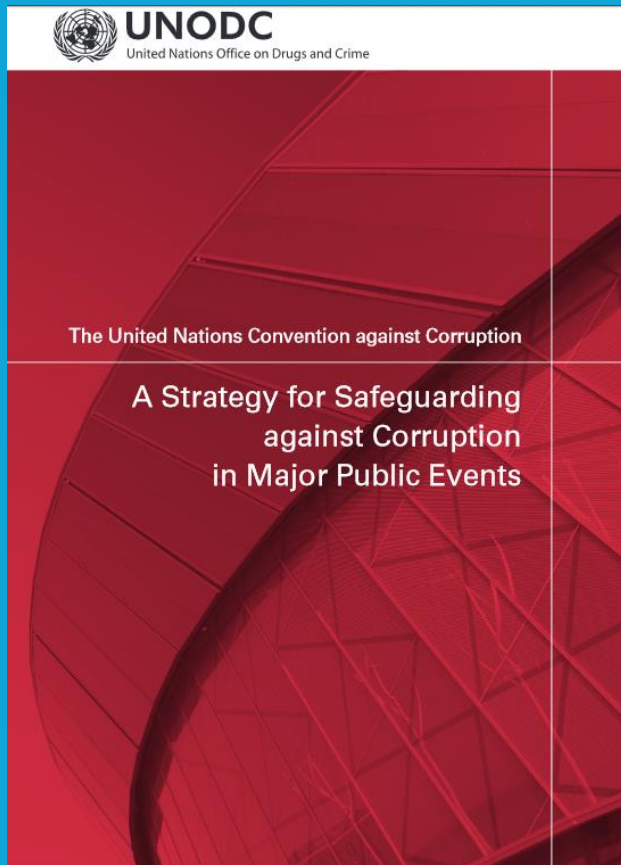
- A) Criminal cases and other practices linked to integrity in sport
 - UNCAC article 14 (prevention of money-laundering)
- B) Establishment of specialized authorities responsible for dealing with offences relating to integrity in sport
 - UNCAC article 6 (preventive bodies)



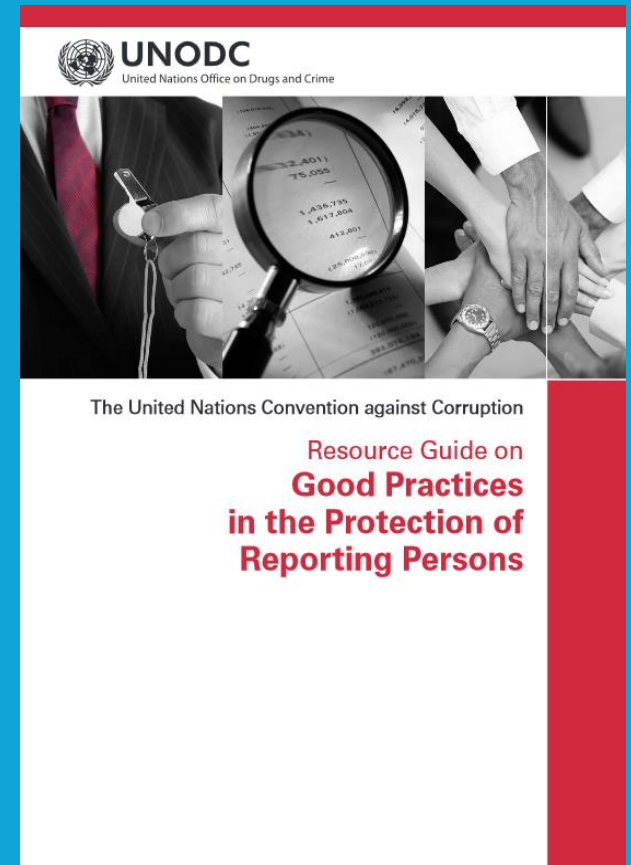
3. UNODC work in Integrity in Sport

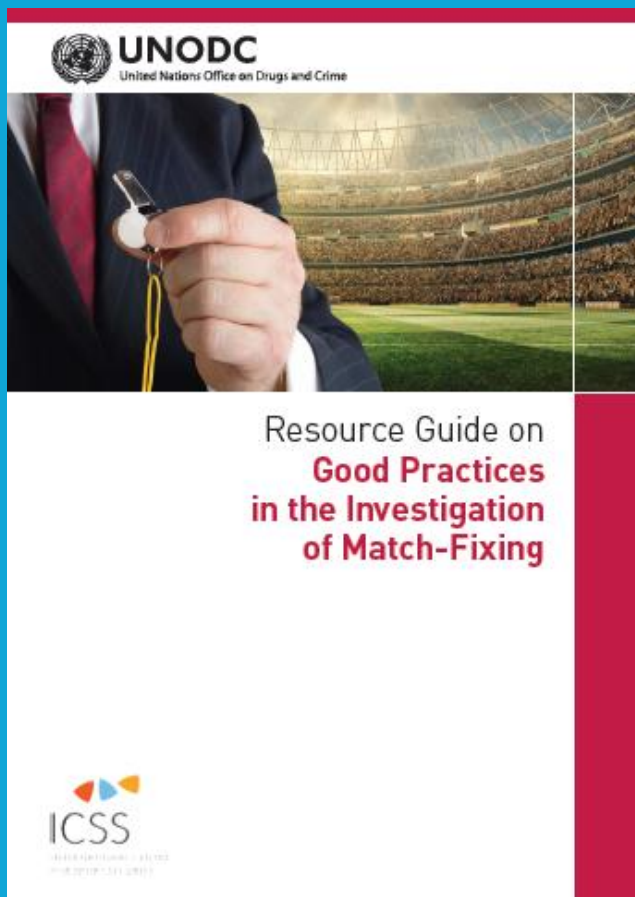
