## Financial and budgetary matters

### Note by the Secretariat

1. Pursuant to rule 72, entitled “Preparation of a budget”, of the rules of procedure for the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime, the Secretariat is requested to prepare a budget for the financing of activities of the Conference related to technical cooperation undertaken in accordance with articles 29 to 32 of the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime, article 10 of the Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons, Especially Women and Children, supplementing the Organized Crime Convention, article 14 of the Protocol against the Smuggling of Migrants by Land, Sea and Air, supplementing the Organized Crime Convention, and article 14 of the Protocol against the Illicit Manufacturing of and Trafficking in Firearms, Their Parts and Components and Ammunition, supplementing the Organized Crime Convention.
2. The present document contains budgetary information on expenditure incurred since the eighth session of the Conference of the Parties in relation to assistance provided by the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) to promote the ratification and implementation of the Convention and its Protocols, as well as information on voluntary contributions and projected expenditure.
3. Pursuant to article 30, paragraph 2 (c), of the Organized Crime Convention, the provision of technical assistance to developing countries and countries with economies in transition for the implementation of the Convention is funded through voluntary contributions. Also under that article, States parties to the Convention are to endeavour to make adequate and regular voluntary contributions to the account specifically designated for that purpose.
4. In its resolution [55/25](#), the General Assembly adopted the Convention and decided that, until the Conference of the Parties decided otherwise, the account would be operated within the United Nations Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Fund. In the same resolution, the Assembly encouraged Member States to make adequate voluntary contributions to that account for the provision of the technical assistance that countries might require for implementation of the Convention and its Protocols, including for the preparatory measures needed for that implementation. Also in the same resolution, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to provide

the Centre for International Crime Prevention (now UNODC) with the resources necessary to enable it to promote in an effective manner the expeditious entry into force of the Convention and to discharge the functions of secretariat of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention.

5. In order to comply with General Assembly resolution [55/25](#), an account was opened within the United Nations Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice Fund for the provision of the above-mentioned activities.

6. In practice, contributions for the technical assistance activities required to implement the Convention and its Protocols have also been made to other projects implemented by UNODC that contribute to countering transnational organized crime and trafficking.

7. The Secretariat invites Member States to continue providing financial support for the technical assistance delivered by UNODC in order to assist States in implementing the Convention and its Protocols.

8. With a view to enhancing transparency and reporting, information on the current status of the account is contained in annex I to the present note. Table 1, contained in annex I, presents the status of pledges to the global project entitled “Support to the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime” that have been received since March 2000, based on information available as at 30 June 2018. Table 2 presents the projected fund requirement, as at 30 June 2018. Annex II contains the expenditure and estimates for projects implemented by UNODC that contribute to countering transnational organized crime and trafficking, based on information available as at 30 June 2018.
