**CV/short bio:** Lucie Léonard is the Director of Justice and Community Safety Statistics, at Statistics Canada. For many years, she was at the Ministry of Public Safety as the Chief in the Research Division, of the Community Safety and Countering Crime Branch. Lucie Léonard is a criminologist and graduated from a master's degree in Criminology from the University of Montreal. She has worked in the areas of criminal justice and crime prevention during the past 20 years, working for the city and police services in Montreal, the International Centre for the Prevention of Crime and University-based research centres, the United Nations and the federal government (Justice Canada, Public Safety Canada). She was involved as well in the development of the 2002 Guidelines on Crime Prevention adopted by the United Nations and related tools for planning and delivering effective crime prevention, including the Local Safety Audits tools, the Guidelines on Safer Cities and collaboration with the United Nations on Urban Safety and the launch and evaluation of the Global Youth Sports and Crime Prevention Initiative.
