## Questions and Answers

**for Call for Proposals for the CHILD Implementation Grants Programme for children exposed to drugs at a very young age or at risk of using drugs**

**Question 1: What are the eligible countries under the criteria of being low- or middle-income countries from Africa, Asia and South America?**

**Answer 1:** As per Section 1.4 of the CHILD Call for Proposals document, the applicants from low- and middle-income countries in South America, Asia, or Africa that seek to implement projects for beneficiaries of the same country are eligible for grant funding. Countries are classified as low-, lower-middle- or upper-middle- income economies as according to the World Bank country classifications.

The complete list of countries as per the World Bank country classifications can be found under the following link: <https://data.worldbank.org/country> . There is a possibility to further filter by the income level or region.

**Question 2: Are documents available in other UN official languages i.e., Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish?**

**Answer 2:** All documents including the Call for Proposals and accompanying annexes that the applicants are required to read and fill are available only in English. Applicants are welcome to submit their applications and other information in English and Spanish.

**Question 3: What documents must be provided as a part of the applications?**

**Answer 3:** Annex 1 Concept Note Application Form, Annex 2 Self-assessment of Eligibility Form, and Annex 3 Partner Declaration must be fully completed, signed and submitted. **Question 4: Are organizations that have never been trained on the CHILD curriculum but working with children at risk of using drugs and children exposed to drugs at a very young age eligible to apply?**

**Answer 4:** No. The applicant must have staff within their organization that have completed all six courses of the CHILD curriculum and at least one course of the CHILD training of trainers.

**Question 5: Can a USD bank account be opened after the deadline i.e., 8 August 2022?**

**Answer 5:** As per stipulated eligibility criteria in the CFP, the applicants must have a bank account capable of receiving international deposit. The final bank account will need to be confirmed at the grant agreement stage.

**Question 6:** En mi organización tenemos interés en participar en el llamado para implementar CHILD, pero tenemos la duda de si podemos hacerlo o no. Al revisar el portal de Partner de UN y la documentación para la postulación, señalan expresamente que son para organizaciones no gubernamentales. ¿El portal de Partner permite que nos inscribamos aún siendo un organismo de gobierno?

Adicionalmente, tengo otra duda: de ser posible que participemos organismos de gobierno, ¿qué ocurre con el requisito de tener dos años de inscripción legal?

In my organization we are interested in participating in the call to implement CHILD, but we have doubts as to whether we can do it or not. When reviewing the UN Partner portal and the application documentation, they expressly indicate that they are for non-governmental organizations. Does the Partner portal allow us to register even if we are a government body?

Additionally, I have another question: if it is possible for government agencies to participate, what happens with the requirement of having two years of legal registration?

**What type of organizations are to be understood under not-for-profit organizations?**

**Answer 6:**

As per stipulated eligibility criteria in the CHILD CFP, the applicant must be a non-profit making organization (CSOs including NGOs, CBOs, non-profit academic institutions) registered for not less than two (2) years from the date of application under the relevant Laws of the country where it is registered.

The registration on the UN Partner Portal is open to Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) – non-government organizations, community-based organizations and academic institutions.
